

## **COVID-19 Information**

### **GA has developed overarching principles to guide our work:**

- We will provide engaging and exciting programming for all campers.
- We will take every precaution to ensure the health and wellness of our entire community.
- We will take care of ourselves, each other, and our community.

We have developed an array of solutions in order to be prepared under any circumstances to achieve these goals. The health and safety of our community members are our top priorities. We are following not just the guidelines of the state and county, but we have invested significant time researching best practices published by the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, and the Centers for Disease Control.

#### **Changes for Camp 2021:**

- Smaller groups, limited enrollment
- Mask wearing, increased handwashing, and social distancing
- Smaller "Troops" and Cohorts for Day Campers
- Assigned indoor spaces for each cohort in the event of inclement weather
- Longer breaks between activities for cleaning and sanitization
- Strategic scheduling and planning for shared spaces
- On-campus activities for our older campers
- Increased on-campus special events
- Health Forms and Daily Symptom/Temperature Checks
- Outdoor locations for lunch
- Additional counselors to assist with cleaning between activities

#### **Campus Enhancements:**

- Plexiglass table dividers
- Hallway directional signs
- Posted room capacities
- Social distancing markers and signage
- Additional handwashing stations
- Room Foggers and sprayers
- Increased housekeeping staff

## COVID-19 CAMP Exclusion Requirements



### COVID-19 Symptoms

**TWO** of the following symptoms: chills, fatigue, myalgia, headache, sore throat, congestion, nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea, **OR**

**ONE** of the following symptoms: fever (100 or higher), new onset of cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, or new loss of taste or smell

**If individual is displaying symptoms as stated above, individual should be tested for COVID-19.**

- If test result is negative OR doctor's note with differential diagnosis OR quarantine complete, return to school after 24 hours fever free.
- If test result is positive or individual is unable/refuses to get tested, may return to school after:
  - 10 days since symptoms first appeared AND
  - 24 hours with no fever AND
  - Improvement in symptoms

## COVID-19 CAMP Exclusion Requirements



### Positive COVID-19 PCR Test

#### WITH SYMPTOMS

May return to school after:

- 24 hours with no fever **AND**
- Improvement in symptoms **AND**
- 10 days since symptoms first appeared

#### WITHOUT SYMPTOMS

May return to school after:

- 10 days after PCR test was collected

*\*If symptoms develop during the 10 days, follow Return to School Guidance for Positive PCR with Symptoms*

## COVID-19 CAMP Exclusion Requirements



### Close Contact to Positive

- **Within 6ft for 15 minutes or more**
- **Household contact**

#### WITH SYMPTOMS

Individual should be tested for COVID-19

- If test result is negative, return to school 14 days after last exposure to the person with COVID-19 and symptoms have resolved
- If test is positive, follow Return to School Guidance for Positive PCR with Symptoms

#### WITHOUT SYMPTOMS

Excluded 7 days after last date of exposure to the person with COVID-19

- If after day 5, a negative test will allow return after day 7 OR no testing, but symptom free after 10 days
- Household contacts are in quarantine until 14 days **AFTER** household positive is released from isolation

*\* If symptoms develop during the quarantine, follow Return to School Guidance for Close Contact with Symptoms*

# COVID-19 CAMP Exclusion Requirements



## Travel Outside of Pennsylvania

### WITH SYMPTOMS

If symptoms develop during the recommended 10 day quarantine upon return to PA, follow Return to School Guidance for COVID-19 Symptoms

### WITHOUT SYMPTOMS

Self-quarantine for 10 days upon return to PA  
OR a negative test within 72 hours

## **A Positive COVID-19 Test at Camp**

When someone on campus has tested positive for COVID-19, Germantown Academy will work with the Montgomery County Department of Health, and will contact anyone at risk using the following protocols:

- Follow the protocols designated by the Department of Health
- Disinfect and clean classroom and primary spaces where the infected individual spent significant time
- Identify all “close contacts” and execute GA’s contact tracing protocols as listed below
- Notify all “close contacts” without identifying by name individuals who have tested positive
- Inform those individuals to stay home and self-monitor for symptoms, and follow CDC guidelines if symptoms develop
- Inform community members who may have interacted with the infected individual, even if they do not qualify as a “close contact.”

If campers test positive for COVID-19, local county health departments will be in contact with the individuals and their close contacts regarding recommendations for quarantining and monitoring of symptoms to mitigate the spread of the virus.
